COMMITTEE REPORTS, RECOMMENDATIONS AND MOTIONS

This month's Committee reports were presented in the following order:

Operations:

Dale Amaral reported that the Operations Committee met on September 2, 2015, at 9:33 a.m., and highlighted the following:

Staff presented a request from Alameda County to review new pay item County Reentry Prog Resp – Code 41F.

After Staff's evaluation, it was determined since Pay Code 41F is for one member in this classification, it will not be considered pensionable compensation according to Government Code Section 7522.34, which applies to new members (PEPRA) as of January 1, 2013. However, it will be considered compensation earnable for members (legacy) with entry dates prior to January 1, 2013 based on Government Code Section 31461.

<u>15-108</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by Donald White that the Board approve the non-inclusion of the newly created pay item 41F – County Re-entry Prog Resp, as pensionable compensation for a member (PEPRA) with an entry date on or after January 1, 2013; <u>and</u> approve the inclusion of the newly created pay item 41F – County Re-entry Prog Resp, as compensation earnable for a member (legacy) with an entry date prior to January 1, 2013. The motion carried 7 yes (*Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, Walker, White, Wood*), 1 recusal (*Amaral*), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Prior to any discussion, Elizabeth Rogers recused herself. Staff presented a request from Alameda County to review new pay item Lead/Trng Resp (PD Oak Office) – Code 41G.

After Staff's evaluation, it was determined since Pay Code 41G is for one member in this classification, it will not be considered pensionable compensation according to Government Code Section 7522.34, which applies to new members (PEPRA) as of January 1, 2013. However, it will be considered compensation earnable for members (legacy) with entry dates prior to January 1, 2013 based on Government Code Section 31461.

<u>15-109</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by David Safer that the Board approve the non-inclusion of the newly created pay item 41G – Lead/Trng Resp (PD Oak Office), as pensionable compensation for a member (PEPRA) with an entry date on or after January 1, 2013; <u>and</u> approve the inclusion of the newly created pay item 41G – Lead/Trng Resp (PD Oak Office), as compensation earnable for a member (legacy) with an entry date prior to January 1, 2013. The motion carried 7 yes (*Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, Walker, White, Wood*), 1 recusal (*Amaral*), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Staff presented a request from Alameda County to review new pay item Supervise Prof Standards Unit – Code 41H.

After Staff's evaluation, it was determined since Pay Code 41H is for one member in this classification, it will not be considered pensionable compensation according to Government Code Section 7522.34, which applies to new members (PEPRA) as of January 1, 2013. However, it will be considered compensation earnable for members (legacy) with entry dates prior to January 1, 2013 based on Government Code Section 31461.

<u>15-110</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by David Safer that the Board approve the non-inclusion of the newly created pay item 41H – Supervise Prof Standards Unit, as pensionable compensation for a member (PEPRA) with an entry date on or after January 1, 2013; <u>and</u> approve the inclusion of the newly created pay item 41H – Supervise Prof Standards Unit, as compensation earnable for a member (legacy) with an entry date prior to January 1, 2013. The motion carried 7 yes (*Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Walker, Wood*), 1 recusal (*Amaral*), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Staff presented a request from Alameda County to review new pay item Supervise/Coord Support Staff Wrk – Code 41I.

After Staff's evaluation, it was determined since Pay Code 41I is for one member in this classification, it will not be considered pensionable compensation according to Government Code Section 7522.34, which applies to new members (PEPRA) as of January 1, 2013. However, it will be considered compensation earnable for members (legacy) with entry dates prior to January 1, 2013 based on Government Code Section 31461.

<u>15-111</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by Donald White that the Board approve the non-inclusion of the newly created pay item 41I – Supervise/Coord Support Staff, as pensionable compensation for a member (PEPRA) with an entry date on or after January 1, 2013; <u>and</u> approve the inclusion of the newly created pay item 41I – Supervise/Coord Support Staff, as compensation earnable for a member (legacy) with an entry date prior to January 1, 2013. The motion carried 7 yes (Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Walker, Wood), 1 recusal (Amaral), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Prior to the discussion, Dale Amaral recused himself. Staff presented a request from Alameda County to review new pay item Emergency Compensation – Code 353.

After Staff's evaluation, it was determined since this pay item applies to more than one member in this classification, it will be considered pensionable compensation for members (PEPRA) with entry dates on or after January 1, 2013 based on Government Code Section 7522.34 and compensation earnable for members (legacy) with entry dates prior to January 1, 2013 based on Government Code Section 31461.

15-112

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble, and seconded by David Safer that the Board approve the inclusion of pay item 353 – Emergency Compensation, as compensation earnable and pensionable compensation for members with entry dates before, on or after January 1, 2013. The motion carried 7 yes (Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Walker, Wood) 1 recusal (Amaral), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Staff explained that WACO, ACERA's external auditor, is requesting an additional \$6,000 to amend WACO's two-year service agreement extension for independent actuarial services associated with auditing GASB 67 & 68 financial reporting schedules.

15-113

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by Donald White that the Board approve an additional \$6,000 for Williams, Adley & Company's two year contract extension of the 2009 Agreement of Audit Services between ACERA and Williams, Adley & Company, extending the contract term through December 31, 2016. The motion carried 7 yes (Amaral, Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Wood), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Staff presented several proposed revisions to the ACERA Travel Policy. This Policy is reviewed annually during the budgetary process.

Following a review and discussion of the policy, the Committee directed Staff to bring the policy back after revisions are made in order to align the ACERA Travel Policy with the Staff Travel Policy. The Trustees also directed Staff to bring a report to the Budget Committee identifying the conferences and training that Trustees attended over the previous three years, together with the associated expenses. There was no action taken.

Staff presented the proposed revisions to the Trustee Education Policy. The Committee was reminded that this policy is reviewed annually with the ACERA Travel Policy.

<u>15-114</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by David Safer that the Board adopt the Trustee Education Policy, with the suggested revisions. The motion carried 7 yes (Amaral, Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Wood), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Staff presented the revised Recovery of Overpayment of Member Benefits and Underpayment of Member Contributions Policy reflecting the changes that were requested by the Trustees at the August 5th Committee meeting. Following a review and discussion of the policy, the Trustees directed Staff to make one additional change.

<u>15-115</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by David Safer that the Board adopt the Recovery of Overpayment of Member Benefits and Underpayment of Member Contributions Policy with the recommended change. The motion carried 7 yes (Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Walker, Wood), 1 recusal (Amaral) 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Staff presented the year-to-date operating expenses – budget vs. actual. As of July 31, 2015 actual expenses are \$1,472,980 under budget.

Staff presented a report on the recruitment process for ACERA. The Committee requested Staff to estimate the cost for ACERA to conduct its own recruitment.

ADJOURMENT INTO CLOSED EXECUTIVE SESSION

Pursuant to Government Code §54956.9(a) the meeting adjourned at 10:41 a.m. into Closed Executive Session to confer with legal counsel regarding pending litigation in the matter of:

- 1) Alameda County Employees' Retirement Association v. BP PLC, Case No. 4:12-CV-1256; and
- 2) Trustees of the Mineworkers' Pension Scheme Limited and Others v. The Royal Bank of Scotland Group plc HC12D01192.

The meeting continued at 10:47 a.m. in Closed Executive Session to consider Robyn Rivera's appeal of Staff's determination that Ms. Rivera is ineligible for a disability retirement. At this time, Dale Amaral recused himself. Ms. Rivera was not present, but was represented at the meeting by her attorney, Mr. Phil Allen. Ms. Marguerite Malloy, Associate Counsel, was present to represent ACERA on the case. Ms. Lori Schnall, Associate Counsel, was present to advise the Trustees.

RETURN TO OPEN SESSION

The Committee reconvened into open session at 11:35 a.m. and reported that no action was taken with respect to the pending securities litigation.

In addition, it was reported that following a discussion, Elizabeth Rogers moved, and Ophelia Basgal seconded, that the Operations Committee recommends to the Board of Retirement that the Board deny Ms. Robyn Rivera's appeal of Staff's determination that Ms. Rivera is ineligible for a disability retirement.

<u>15-116</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by George Wood that the Board approve the September 2, 2015, Operations Committee minutes. The motion carried 7 yes (*Amaral, Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Wood*), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Retirees:

David Safer reported that the Retirees Committee met September 2, 2015, at 11:44 a.m., and highlighted the following:

Staff presented suggested revised language for the Supplemental Retiree Benefit Reserve (SRBR) Policy to include the changes to the Monthly Medical Allowance (MMA) section of the Policy, allowing for the MMA benefit for the new category of early retirees eligible to enroll in individual medical plans.

In response to a question raised by a Trustee, Staff clarified that only early retirees living outside the HMO service areas will be able to enroll in the Health Exchange, and agreed to change the suggested language of the Policy to reflect this fact.

<u>15-117</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by David Safer that the Board adopt the revisions to the Supplemental Retiree Benefit Reserve Policy to include the changes to the Monthly Medical Allowance (MMA) section of the Policy, allowing for the MMA benefit for the new category of early retirees eligible to enroll in individual medical plans, with the appropriate revisions to clarify which early retirees are eligible for enrollment in the Health Exchange. The motion carried 7 yes (Amaral, Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Wood), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Staff provided summarized information regarding renewal rates and plan coverage for the plan year February 1, 2016 through January 31, 2017. In addition, the County of Alameda presented more detailed information on the renewal of County medical plan contracts for the 2016 plan year.

Delta Dental and Keenan & Associates, ACERA's Benefits Consultant, provided additional information regarding ACERA retirees' dental plan benefit utilization as well as the industry average of dental utilization.

Staff gave a report on planning for ACERA's annual Open Enrollment and Retiree Health Fair.

Staff provided information regarding a news report about CVS overcharging customers for generic prescription drugs, and an issue concerning invoices members received directly from CalPERS for their long term care benefit premiums.

<u>15-118</u>

It was moved by Tarrell Gamble and seconded by George Wood that the Board approve the September 2, 2015, Retirees Committee minutes. The motion carried 7 yes (*Amaral, Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Wood*), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

CEO Succession:

The Committee reviewed and discussed the recruitment and selection process, timeline and expectations regarding the selection of the Chief Executive Officer.

RETURN TO OPEN SESSION

The Committee reconvened into open session at 2:12 p.m. and reported that the Committee reviewed and approved the recommended language for the recruitment brochure and advertisement for the Chief Executive Officer position.

Sherrill Uyeda, Alliance Resource Consulting, LLC, was present at the meeting, participated in the discussion, and provided recommendations to the Committee.

The Committee directed Staff to makes changes to the Chief Executive Officer County Job Description and bring it back to the Committee for approval.

<u>15-119</u>

It was moved by George Wood and seconded by Tarrell Gamble that the Board approve the September 2, 2015, CEO Succession Committee minutes. The motion carried 7 yes (*Amaral, Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Wood*), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Investment:

George Wood reported that the Investment Committee met on September 9, 2015, at 9:39 a.m., and highlighted the following:

Representatives from Mondrian Investment Partners discussed its investment philosophy, investment strategy, portfolio characteristics, and performance. The review revealed Mondrian Investment Partners to be in compliance with ACERA's investment guidelines. For the periods ending 06/30/15, ACERA's account managed by Mondrian returned (net) 3.92% YTD, -6.38% for one year, and 7.61% annualized since inception. The assets in ACERA's account with Mondrian were \$588 million at 06/30/15.

The review found Mondrian to be in compliance with ACERA's reporting requirements; however, Staff will continue to closely monitor its performance as Mondrian remains on Watchlist and Probation.

Quarterly Performance Review for the Second Quarter of 2015 – Equities, Fixed Income, and Real Return Pool.

For 2Q2015, ACERA's Total Fund returned 1.2% (gross), compared to the policy index of 0.5%. For the year ending on June 30, 2015, the Total Fund returned 2.8% (gross) compared to the policy index of 3.2%. The Total Fund ranked in the 3rd and 62nd percentile for the quarter and one year periods, respectively. U.S. Equity accounted for 35.4% of the Total Fund, International Equity 28.6%, Fixed Income 15.8%, and the Real Return Pool 3.9%.

For 2Q2015, ACERA's U.S. Equity, International Equity, Fixed Income, and Real Return Pool asset classes returned 1.5%, 1.0%, -1.6%, and 0.2% (gross) compared to their benchmarks 0.1%, 1.2%, -1.5%, and 1.5%, respectively. On a 1-year basis, these asset classes returned 8.3%, -4.1%, 0.6%, and -22.8%, respectively.

As of 06/30/2015, the market value of the Total Fund was \$6,937,697,459.

The Chair welcomed Callan Associates, ACERA's new Real Estate Investment Consultant, as the representatives made their first presentation since being hired at the end of July 2015. Accordingly, Callan Associates presented a high level review of current market conditions and ACERA's real estate portfolio. Representatives suggested they would soon provide an overview of ACERA's real estate policy and investment plan to bring ACERA up to date with the current real estate environment.

ACERA's real estate portfolio returned 8.5% (gross) for the first half of 2015, outperforming the NFI-ODCE index of 6.8%.

As of the 2nd quarter of 2015, the real estate portfolio returned 5.1% and outperformed the NCREIF-ODCE index of 3.8%.

The total market value of ACERA's real estate portfolio was \$469.8 million; approximately 6.8% of ACERA's total Fund.

<u>15-120</u>

It was moved by George Wood and seconded by David Safer that the Board approve the September 9, 2015, Investment Committee minutes. The motion carried 7 yes (Amaral, Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Wood), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Actuarial:

Keith Carson gave an oral report at today's Board meeting regarding the following informational items discussed at the September 17, 2015 Actuarial Committee meeting:

The Committee had an in-depth discussion regarding the treatment of the Contingency Reserve Account (CRA) and interest crediting; this item will be brought back to the Actuarial Committee and the Board for consideration.

The Committee proposed two options for issuance of a Request for Proposal (RFP) to engage in an actuarial consulting firm. It was noted that the Committee may choose Option 1, which extends Segal's contract for one year (*i.e.*, through the end of 2016) so that Segal can perform several pending Valuations; this item will be brought back to the Committee and the Board for consideration.

Note: The formal written September 17, 2015 Actuarial Committee minutes will be included for approval on the October 15, 2015 Board Consent Calendar.

NEW BUSINESS:

Kathy Foster, Interim Chief Executive Officer, requested authority from the Board to vote as ACERA's proxy on behalf of the Board of Retirement at the SACRS Fall Conference.

<u>15-121</u>

It was moved by Donald White and seconded by David Safer to direct the Interim Chief Executive Officer to vote as ACERA's proxy on behalf of the Board of Retirement at the SACRS Fall Conference. The motion carried 7 yes (*Amaral, Carson, Gamble, Rogers, Safer, White, Wood*), 0 no, and 0 abstentions.

Kathy Foster, Interim Chief Executive Officer's Oral Report.

- Congratulated incumbent, Elizabeth Rogers, for running unopposed for the Second Seat on the ACERA Board of Retirement. As a result, ACERA will not conduct an election in 2015 and will work with ACERA's Legal Department in making a request to the Board of Supervisors to direct the Clerk of the Board to cast a unanimous ballot in favor of Ms. Rogers.
- Completed and submitted ACERA's 2014 Comprehensive Accounting Financial Report (CAFR) and Popular Accounting Financial Report (PAFR) to the Staff Controller of the Government Financial Office of Accounting in August 2015 – Thanked the ACERA Fiscal Services and Communications Department Staff for all their hard work on this project.
- ACERA Senior Managers are working on their proposed 2016 Department Budgets and Off-Site Presentations for consideration by the Board.
- ACERA will conduct a Retiree Education Session on Tuesday, September 22, 2015 at 1:00 p.m.
- ACERA is exploring the possibility of outsourcing its Disability Retirement Application Process (*i.e.*, the exhibiting, medical review, and medical recommendation processes), which will cost half of what ACERA currently pays its Medical Advisor. It was noted that this change would have no impact on Member Services and may prevent ACERA from hiring additional Staff due to an increase in workload.
- An Outsourcing Services Provider will conduct an educational Session at the SACRS Conference on Tuesday, November 17, 2015 to explain the benefits of outsourcing and the operational and legal aspects involved. Ms. Foster will conduct a Session at the SACRS Conference on Friday, November 20, 2015 regarding the "Three-Legged Stool and Retirement Readiness" concept and how the defined contribution plan may play a bigger role due to pension reform and reduced benefits.
- Congratulated ACERA Staff who participated in the Active for Life Program and for coming in as number 1 in the County for Team Spirit!

CONFERENCE REPORTS

George Wood attended a Due Diligence Trip with ACERA Investment Department Staff to gain more education and knowledge regarding ACERA's real return pool portfolio. It was noted that Trustee Wood and the Investment Staff had an in-depth discussion with some prospective partners regarding this type of investment.

TRUSTEE/PUBLIC INPUT

On behalf of the ACRE Chapter of SEIU, Local 1021, Pete Albert congratulated incumbent Trustee Rogers for retaining the Second Seat on the ACERA Board of Retirement.

Several Trustees complemented Staff and ACERA's actuaries and auditors for a job well done regarding the timely completion of the CAFR in spite of all the GASB issues Staff encountered.
